HB1201 - make an appropriation for the teacher apprenticeship pathway program.

*Online program designed to help paraprofessionals obtain a teacher certification. They must be employed full-time. It would be the first program of this type in the country. Mostly sp. ed. paras to begin with. They have had 299 applicants. 88 participants already. Started last year and asking for funding to continue as they are halfway thru the first group (4 years). With this funding, they could add 75 more paras. This would address a great need in our state.

*Bill sent to <u>House Committee on Appropriations</u> (bills requiring money usually end up in this committee).

*I like that these paras are working under certified teachers in the classroom as part of the requirement. I believe this to be a good bill for SD and would like to see it expanded.

SB79 - revise provisions related to the possession, distribution, and manufacture of child pornography.

*includes computer generated images and much more detailed with the digital side of child pornography.

*SIGNED INTO LAW!

HB 1197 - require the publication of measures taken to restrict the access of obscene materials by minors.

*This bill provides and avenue for parents/citizens to express concern/complaints about material in the public libraries and public schools.

*It would also include providing public access computers with filter services to limit obscene material.

*Cleared committee/floor side in the House and now in Senate Ed.

HB 1192 - enhance the penalty for rape of a child twelve years of age or under.

*This bill has greater penalties. Moves it to a Class B felony and allows for a life sentence.

*Cleared committee and House floor without objection in either; moves to Senate Judiciary and hopefully Senate floor.

HB 1178 - prohibit the Board of Regents or any institution under its control from using state resources for obscene live conduct.

*This ONLY applies to state owned properties like universities; NOT on private properties.

HB 1250 - provide for the creation and use of South Dakota educational empowerment accounts.

*ESA (Education Savings Account) in 11 states now; Iowa and AZ being two.

*STRONG school choice bill

HB 1198 - revise the process for nominating candidates for the offices of lieutenant governor, attorney general, and secretary of state.

*This bill had FIVE amendments; lasted two days; most having to do with removing Lt. Gov and keeping AG and SOS in GOP convention

*In the end, it failed to pass on the House floor (Yeas 31/Nays 36)

^{*&}quot;obscene live conduct" is NOT protected by the 1st amendment as it was argued by opponents of the bill in committee.

^{*}Regents have made efforts to make policies re: this issue but hard to enforce; this is a law and more uniform and enforceable.

^{*}Passed House State Affairs and House floor (59-8); most likely moves to State Senate Affairs.

^{*}Can be used for private schools, homeschooling, public schools (tutoring/supplies)

^{*}Much discussion; amendments were made; passed out of House Education committee; it is good to see SD move in this direction. I would expect to see this again next year.

^{*}Motion was made to "calendar" the bill on the House floor (move to another day), but this failed to get enough votes (Yeas 23/Nays 41).

^{*}Be watching SB 13 - revise the process for nominating candidates for lieutenant governor.

^{*}Keep emails/texts short.

^{*}Be respectful (and thankful if they have voted well on a bill!)

^{*}Include bill number in "subject" field on email. Some may only have time to read those! So "subject" may say, "Please vote YES on HB1234"
